

Zoe Zeniodi, conductor and pianist

Zoe Zeniodi is the Head of Music and Assistant Conductor of the Florida Grand Opera, Music Director of the Broward Symphony Orchestra, Artistic Director and Principal Conductor of the Alhambra Orchestra, and Assistant Conductor of the Palm Beach Symphony, where she also appears as a guest conductor.

She has appeared as a guest conductor with the City of Thessaloniki Symphony Orchestra, New Philharmonic Orchestra of Florida, Florida Youth Orchestra, and the National Youth Orchestra of Spain (JONDE).

During her tenure as Associate Conductor of the Frost Symphony Orchestra from 2007 to 2011, she released two recordings on the Albany label to critical acclaim—Thomas Sleeper’s “Xenia” and Frank Ticheli’s “An American Dream.” Her recent recording of Sleeper’s “Translucence” with the Brno Philharmonic was released on January 1, 2014, and she is currently preparing to record Sleeper’s solo piano works.



As a pianist, she has performed in the Purcell Room and St. Martin-in-the-Fields (England); the National Opera House, the Athens and Thessaloniki Concert Halls, and the Onassis Cultural Center (Greece); the Montpellier Festival (France); the Lisinski Concert Hall (Croatia); the European Union Hall (Belgium); and the Internationales Theater Frankfurt (Germany), among others.

She holds a Doctorate of Musical Arts and an Artist Diploma in Orchestra Conducting from the University of Miami (FL), and a

Master’s degree and Bachelor’s degree in Piano Performance and Accompaniment from the Royal College of Music in London and the Mozarteum in Salzburg. During her studies she won all the piano accompaniment prizes at the Royal College of Music where she was named a Junior Fellow in 2003.
